

Seth Adam Cook (b. 1993) is an artist and researcher from Bayou Teche, Louisiana. He became interested in the arts while attending high school, deciding then to study it at the university level. Later in his studies, photography became the catalyst to his creative process, seeing it as a new way of identifying himself with art; using the medium as the primary tool to express his concerns.

In the summer of 2019, Seth accepted and participated in a summer-long paid internship at the Heritage Museums and Garden in Cape Cod, MA. He is currently pursuing his Master of Fine Arts at Indiana University, Bloomington while working as an Assistant Instructor.
